



## TENURE TRACK ASSISTANT PROFESSOR

**Position:** The Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics in the College of Public Health at the University of Georgia invites applicants for a tenure track faculty position at the assistant professor rank, with a special focus on Infectious Disease Epidemiology and Modeling. The position is an academic year appointment (9 months) with an opportunity to supplement salary during the summer. The anticipated starting date for the position is August 2021.

**Qualifications:** Applicants must have a terminal degree (PhD, MD or other relevant degree) in Epidemiology, Biostatistics, or closely related field. Additionally, candidates should demonstrate the promise of moving towards excellence in research productivity and have a background commensurate with appointment to the rank of assistant professor. Applicants with research in infectious disease epidemiology or biostatistical methods with history of external funding are especially encouraged to apply.

**Responsibilities:** The person hired for this position is expected to develop and teach innovative undergraduate and graduate courses focusing on introductory, intermediate, and advanced epidemiology and/or biostatistics. Commitment to student mentoring and supervision of projects and dissertation research in the department and college is further expected. The successful candidate will be expected to develop a strong and productive research program with extramural funding and devote time to service activities.

**About UGA:** The University of Georgia (UGA) is a land grant and sea grant research university with 35,000 students, 17 schools and colleges, and 1800 faculty, located in Athens. Athens is 60 miles NE of Atlanta and has a rich cultural and intellectual scene that coexists with the university, featuring diverse arts and music, a thriving downtown, college athletics, and historic neighborhoods. UGA provides excellent opportunities to work collaboratively in a multi-disciplinary environment. Investigators at UGA, both within the College of Public Health and beyond, are engaged in a wide spectrum of biomedical and public health research.
