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T15 Training Grant in *Biomedical Informatics & Data Science* to Support Postdoctoral Training for Graduates in Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Health Services Research, and Related Fields

The Biomedical Informatics & Data Science (BIDS) Section of the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine has secured funding for postdoctoral training through a National Library of Medicine (NLM) T15 training grant. "NLM's T15 program offers graduate education and postdoctoral training and research experiences in a wide range of areas including health care informatics, *translational* bioinformatics [emphasis added], clinical informatics, public health informatics, and consumer health informatics." BIDS is looking to partner with departments and centers at Johns Hopkins to support postdoctoral fellows who wish to gain experience in applying biomedical informatics and data science approaches to their primary quantitative skill sets, e.g., biostatistics, epidemiology, health services research, etc. JHU departments and centers can both identify potential postdoctoral fellows and propose faculty preceptors. U.S. Citizens and Permanent Residents are eligible to apply. BIDS will consider both early- and mid-career applicants.
